ADMINISTRATIVE DIRECTION NO. 2004/4

**IMPLEMENTING UNMIK REGULATION NO. 1999/1, AS AMENDED, ON
THE AUTHORITY OF THE INTERIM ADMINISTRATION IN KOSOVO**

The Special Representative of the Secretary-General,

Pursuant to the authority given to him under United Nations Interim Administration Mission in Kosovo (UNMIK) Regulation No. 1999/1 of 25 July 1999, as amended by UNMIK Regulation No. 1999/25 of 12 December 1999 and UNMIK Regulation No. 2000/54 of 27 September 2000, on the authority of the Interim Administration Kosovo,

Noting that the responsibility for civil aviation at Pristina Airport will be transferred from KFOR to UNMIK as of 1 April 2004,

Taking into account UNMIK Regulation No. 2003/18 of 13 June 2003 on the Establishment of a Civil Aviation Regulatory Office for Kosovo (hereinafter "CARO"), UNMIK Regulation No. 2004/5 of 23 February 2004 on the Provisional Regulation of Civil Aviation in Kosovo, and Executive Decision No. 2004/3 of 20 February 2004 on Land Necessary for Civil Aviation Purposes at Pristina Airport,

Taking into account the contractual arrangements made with a member State of the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) for the provision of certain civil aviation functions in Kosovo by that member State on behalf of UNMIK,

In conformity with section 8.1 (s) of the Constitutional Framework for Provisional Self-Government in Kosovo (UNMIK Regulation No. 2001/9 of 15 May 2001), and taking into account UNMIK Regulation No. 2002/12 of 13 June 2002 on the Establishment of the Kosovo Trust Agency (KTA Regulation),

In order to consolidate management of all operations and related assets at Pristina Airport,

For the purpose of placing all assets used and operated by Air Traffic Control Services (ATCS) in civil aviation operations at Pristina Airport under the administrative control of Public Enterprise Airport Pristina (PEAP), without prejudice to the ownership status of such assets,

Hereby issues the following Administrative Direction:

Section 1

Authority to Administer and Manage Assets Used for Civil Aviation Purposes at Pristina Airport

Pending promulgation by the Special Representative of the Secretary-General of a Regulation consolidating airport operations under a single management structure, the administrative authority and control of all assets, whether movable or immovable, used and operated by ATCS, such as listed in the Attachment hereto, shall be placed with immediate effect under the administrative control and authority of PEAP, with KTA's oversight in accordance with the KTA Regulation.

Section 2

Entry into Force

The present Administrative Direction shall enter into force on 23 March 2004.
